CCNF Concerns on JRP 2019



1. Financial transparency of Rohingya Aid and Review of JRP 2018
2. Wider space for participation, specially open to the Refugee, local actors and affected communities.



CCNF Concerns on JRP 2019

- Four issues of cross cutting;
 - Integration of localization and Grand Bargain commitments.
 - Whole of society / solidarity approach.
 - New way of working, i.e., nexus of humanitarianism, development and peace.
 - Financial tracking in public participation.



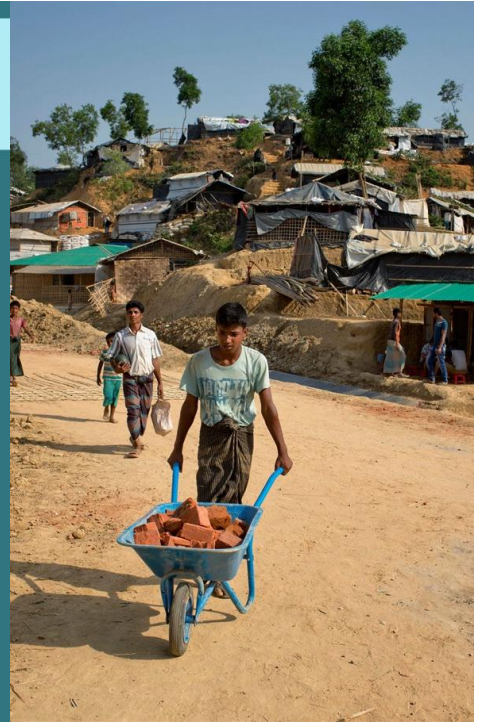
CCNF Proposal in Coordination

- i. Coordination must be led by Government Authority i.e., of RRRC.
- ii. ISCG should part of RRRC office, or ISCG office should be located in RRRC office or there should be a planning and monitoring unit in RRRC office.
- iii. Participation of local government, district and upazila officials.
- iv. Official language in and from Coxsbazar to field must be in Bangla, fixation of weekly meeting day in Coxsbazar.



CCNF Proposal in Coordination

- v. Space and support local NGOs to lead / co lead in ISCG sector group.
- vi. Expatriate for long term duration.
- vii. All project should be based on bottom up need assessment.
- viii. Open and transparent complain response and participation mechanism in all level.
