Learning Center is being opened soon : what must be considered

A good learning center infrastructure makes it possible for the children living in the camp to study and improves the attendance and learning interest of the student and teachers. After being closed, the educational centers will reopen in March. The Coast Foundation has taken all necessary steps to open the learning centers.

All the LCs' condition have been monitored regularly and renovated them in accordance, cleanliness has been ensured, all the guidelines for prevention of COVID have been properly observed and adequate stock of student learning materials has been kept in the learning centers. Each creative classroom has interactive toys, access to natural light, and access to proper ventilation that will assist teachers in teaching and eval-
