Kahinur Begum said that sewing work my daughter college teaching do the cost. Shahinur Begum said I do monthly DPS by sewing.



Shahinur Begum

worked as a housewife for the Shahinur and Kahinur families in the remote area (river side) of Dhania Union in Bhola Sadar Upazila. By joining the 1st page of the GCA project and participating in various ward meetings, workshop, and trainings of the project, they think that it is not

possible to improve the world just by doing housework. And boys and girls are not going to be made to read and write well. How much more does the husband earn in the river? Most of the time there are rakers during the siege. What is the benefit of relying only on the husband? Do the something yourself. This is how two of them take the initiative to sew nakshi kanta. First, they sewed 2/4 of themselves. Now others sew 3/4-thousand-taka contract. 1500, 2000 and 4000 / - per month in this way. Both do monthly DPS of Rs.500 / -. she said the house purchase furniture according to the needs and carries the cost of education for boys and girls. They are both from the same house. sahinur begum (38) has 2 daughters and 1 son. The girl is in college in HSC, the boy is in 9th class. 1 son of kahinur (26) 4 years old. They look and feel very mind happy. Kahinur also worked as a tailor. she is lots of joy in the mind. They said that after sewing our sewing work learning, now women from many more fishers' families in the village also do sewing work. Nakshi draws thorny flowers. They are good too. Our respect in the family has increased as we women are able to provide financial support to the family as well as the men.
