The Coast Foundation has been conducting tree planting activities every year since the beginning of the camp to maintain the balance of the environment as the need for deforestation and forest expansion to make it suitable for human habitation has come up again and again on the recommendation of the Community Disaster Management Committee. At the each learning center run by COAST in Camp-14, every tree is cared for as much as possible after planting.

Matching time table between LC & Moktob

In Camp 14, Block: E-3, the Coast Foundation runs 4 learning centers. According to the Rohingya tradition, it is compulsory for every Rohingya child to study in Mak-

tab. On April 3, a imam of a Maktab asked the students to study in the Maktab till 10 o'clock in the morning. Note that the lessons of the learning center starts at 9 am. Students and parents presented the matter to the teacher at the learning center and ask for help in resolving the matter.

She passed Level-2 in 2020 through assessment. Her teacher Sabekun Nahar said— she is a regular student. Although she cannot speak, she can draw skillfully and beautifully and she is well-up all subjects of her level; her handwriting is clear and visually pleasing.

To ensure the education of every child it is need to aware about Child Right

Coast Foundation has been conducting educational activities in Rohingya refugee camps since its inception. Collects children's data from door to door to ensure the education of every child from the very beginning. To engage interested children in the learning center, and for the children who do not want to be involved in the learning center or do not get proper support from the family different strategies are adopted and make their parents aware of Child Rights.
