Background

Why does the world observe World Humanitarian Day?

• 350 million people worldwide are affected by crises.

• Frontline Humanitarian workers are the lifeline to those in need but are often caught and become a victim.




Campaign Objectives

- 1.To advance a shared understanding of the rights and dignity of frontline NGO workers, affected communities and civilians.
- 2. To strengthen the safety, security, and well-being of frontline NGO workers, people and communities in crisis and vulnerability and promote peaceful coexistence of Rohingya and host communities.
- 3. To encourage governments, international, and national humanitarian responders to effectively apply international humanitarian laws to protect the lives of humanitarian workers and affected communities.



The Plight of Aid Workers

- In 2021, a total of 460 aid workers fell victim to major attacks.
- 140 of them lost their lives.
- Tragically, 98% of those who perished were national staff.
- 266 reported attacks resulted in 203 aid workers sustained serious injuries.
- 117 were kidnapped.


The 2024 Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO) requires \$48.65 billion to assist 187.8 million people in need across 71 countries through 39 coordinated response plans.

Funding for Rohingya and host community





- The government of Bangladesh spends \$ 1.2 billion every year.
- \$ 700 million loans to Bangladesh in two projects.

Recommendations

- Refugees rise, aid falls: Management costs must be cut to reach out to more in need.
- Permit Rohingya people for income-generating activities to reduce pressure on aid.
- No loan to humanitarian response.
- Rohingya community should be allowed travel passes, bank accounts, and education.
- Ensure Accountability to Affected Population.
- Advocate for the survival, well-being, and dignity of all, regardless of affiliation.
- Stop targeting aid workers, all these violations
 and impunity of the perpetrators.
